Pastor's Message

Weekend of March 28, 2021

Dear People of God,

As Jesus entered Jerusalem, just four short days before He would be arrested, He was received with great joy. The crowds spread their cloaks, strewed palm branches before Him and cried out, "Hosanna to the Son of David; blessed is he who comes in the name of the Lord; hosanna in the highest." Jesus, the King of Kings was certainly given a kingly welcome.

He entered this city of David as King and Priest, and He died as the Sacrificial Lamb. He was greeted by shouts of "Hosanna", only to soon hear "Crucify Him, crucify Him!"

What a shock to all the minds and hearts of his faithful followers. How could this happen? How could something so glorious become so painful in such a short time? Rationally, it doesn't seem to make any sense...but from a divine perspective it was the beginning of the most glorious act ever known.

In our own lives, we often do all we can to avoid even the slightest amount of sacrifice. But sacrifice is capable of the greatest good when united to the one Sacrifice of Jesus.

Jesus entered Jerusalem with perfect determination to begin the Sacrifice that would conquer sin and death and defeat the evil one. And that is exactly what He did.

How willing are we to embrace sacrifice in our own lives? Our sacrifices might not be able to save the world by their own merit, but if we face our crosses in life, be they big or small, and if we intentionally unite them to the actions of Jesus that first Holy Week, then we can be certain that we will suffer with the Lord...but we can also be certain that our suffering will be transformed by the power of this Holy week and lead us all to a glorious sharing in His triumph over all sin and suffering.

Don't forget to join us for our Holy Week services and events!

Many thanks to those generous souls who undertook the ministry of reaching out to and calling all those registered with us here at MHC. I know that your efforts will benefit, in a positive way, parish life and its morale in the long run.

FASTING is to be observed on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday by all Catholics between the ages of 18 to 59 years (inclusive). On days of fasting, one full meal is allowed. Two smaller meals, sufficient to maintain strength, may be taken according to one's needs, but together they should not equal another full meal. Eating between meals is not permitted, but liquids are allowed.

ABSTINENCE from meat is to be observed by all Catholics who are 14 years of age and older. Ash Wednesday, all the Fridays of Lent, and Good Friday are days of abstinence. If a person is unable to observe the above regulations due to ill health or other serious reasons, they are urged to practice other forms of self-denial that are suitable to their condition.

The Easter Triduum


The summit of the Liturgical Year is the Easter Triduum–from the evening of Holy Thursday to the evening of Easter Sunday. Though chronologically three days, they are liturgically one day unfolding for us the unity of Christ's Paschal Mystery.

The single celebration of the Triduum marks the end of the Lenten season, and leads to the Mass of the Resurrection of the Lord at the Easter Vigil.












The Sacrament of Baptism

The Sacrament of Holy Communion
