Dear People of God

In today's liturgy we face quite a contrast of experiences and emotions. Jesus was treated as He should have been. People were excited to see Him and there was great celebration at His presence.

But this excitement quickly turned to shock and horror as we enter more deeply into today's readings. The Gospel ends with Jesus hanging on the Cross crying out "My God, my God, why have you forsaken me?" And with that "Jesus gave a loud cry and breathed his last." At that moment the entire congregation kneels in silence as we ponder the reality of Christ's death.

How could the people who were shouting and praising Him as He entered into Jerusalem abandon Him and allow Him to be crucified just a short time later? I guess you could say the simplest answer might be that the Father willed it. I think this is an important concept to understand.

At any time during that first Holy Week Jesus could have exercised His divine power and refused to embrace His Cross. But He didn't. He embraced this week willingly, choosing it as His own will.

Let this week give us all divine hope. Nothing can steal away our joy unless we let it. No hardship, no burden, and no cross can conquer us if we remain steadfast in Jesus letting Him transform all we endure in life by His glorious embrace of His own Cross.

Prayer: Lord, when I am tempted to despair, give me hope. Help me to see your presence in all things, even in those things that are most troubling to me. May this Holy Week transform my darkest moments and weakness as I surrender all to You, my God. Jesus, I trust in You.

Titus Zeman (4 January 1915 – 8 January 1969) was a <u>Slovak Roman Catholic priest</u> and a professed member of the <u>Salesians of Don Bosco</u>. II Zeman studied in Italian cities prior to

his <u>ordination</u> and worked in <u>Slovakia</u> to protect fellow Salesians after the communist regime outlawed religious orders.^[2] He was arrested after attempting to send Salesians out of the nation and was imprisoned from 1952 until 1964 and died due to poor health sustained from the prison conditions. He has been acclaimed as a defender of religious liberties.^[3]

Zeman was acclaimed a <u>Servant of God</u> in 2010 under <u>Pope Benedict XVI</u> after the canonization process commenced in <u>Bratislava</u> – the cause was taken with ascertaining whether Zeman had died "in odium fidei" (in hatred of the faith).^[4] <u>Pope</u> <u>Francis</u> approved his beatification on 27 February 2017; the beatification occurred in Bratislava on 30 September 2017.^[5]6]
