#### Pastor's Message

Weekend of February 14, 2021

Dear People of God,

The four little words that Jesus spoke to the Leper in todays' gospel – "I do will it." - are certainly worth looking into. Let's not be fooled and miss the actual depth and meaning of this statement. The act of Jesus' willing is itself significant. What He willed is also significant for sure. The fact that He cured a leper has great meaning and significance. It certainly shows us his authority over nature. It shows His almighty power. It shows that Jesus can heal all wounds. But don't miss those four words: "I do will it."

The leprosy is a clear sign of our own weaknesses and sin. It is a clear sign of our fallen human nature and weakness. It's a clear sign that we cannot heal ourselves. It's a clear sign that we need the Divine Healer. When we acknowledge all of these realities and truths, we will be in a position, just like the leper, to turn to Jesus, on our knees, and beg His action in our lives.

Prayer: Lord, I give myself to You this Lent. Reveal to me Your divine presence, dwelling deep within me, calling me to Yourself. Help me to strengthen my love and devotion as I try to deepen my sense of true prayer.

- Lent is upon us once again. The words that the Lord gives us through the prophet Joel on Ash Wednesday, are strong and clear. Why must we return to God? Because something is not right in us, not right in our society, not right in the Church, we are all called to change, transform, and move in a new direction. This is nothing less than a call to conversion.
- As we begin this Lenten journey of 40 days, may we here at Mary Help of Christians Parish take
  the time to reevaluate our Baptismal commitment, reset the moral compass within us, and do
  our best to connect our Catholic faith with all that we say and do every day of our lives.





#### Today is World Marriage Day!

On this World Marriage Day, we thank our heavenly Father for the gift and blessing of marriage and the family. As we strive to live our particular vocations and respond to the Lord's grace in our lives, let's also consider how we might dedicate renewed prayer and attention to marriage and the family.

#### As a start, here are possible areas we might consider:

First, we begin with prayer: Let's remember to pray with and for marriages and families throughout our nation: for marriages in crisis, for families struggling with unemployment, for broken or wounded family relationships.

Second, let us reclaim Sunday as the Lord's Day, a day of rest when we can focus on being together as a family. The celebration of Holy Mass together is the first essential way to honor this

day. But is there something more the Lord is inviting us to when we go back home? Set aside some time to pray a decade of the rosary, enjoy the outdoors together, play ball, eat dinner together, have a game night!

And third, let us remember that the Church is the family of God and a family of families. As a family, how can we share Christ with other married couples and families? Do we have any friends and family members who are struggling in their marriage, alone during this time of isolation, or particularly afflicted by this pandemic? When was the last time we checked on our elderly neighbors? Is there someone in the parish that we haven't seen in a while? How can we-as a family-reach out to those who are in need?



# Saint of the Week

# Blessed Fra Angelico

DATES: 1400-1445

FEAST DAY: FEBRUARY 18

🛾 ra Giovanni da Fiesole, known as → Blessed Fra Angelico, was an early Renaissance painter. After joining the Dominicans in 1420, he began illustrating manuscripts and choir books, beginning each new work with a prayer. His religious altarpieces, paintings and frescoes exploited color for spatial and emotional effect. Fra Angelico, meaning "angelic brother," decorated an entire Florentine monastery and two Roman chapels. Notable works include his "Annunciation" and "Descent from the Cross." He declined an appointment as archbishop of Florence and was officially beatified by Pope John Paul II in 1982. Art students often leave written prayers near his tomb in the Church of Santa Maria Sopra Minerva in Rome. He is patron of artists.

# How to Use Text Giving

- Text the word GIVE to the church/organization's text giving number.
- If it's your first time, you'll be prompted to click a link directing you to the online giving page to complete a one-time registration. Click "SIGN IN" then click "REGISTER FOR AN ACCOUNT" at the bottom of the page.
- Complete contact information then click "REGISTER."
- Enter the secure PIN that the system texts you.
- Select the fund, enter the donation amount and payment information before completing your gift.
- Click "SAVE PAYMENT" to keep your payment information securely saved for future gifts.
- To text a donation after the one-time registration, you can give immediately without having to re-enter any of your information.
- Simply text the desired amount and the fund keyword to the text giving number. Ex: 250 tithe for \$250.00 to the Tithe fund.

For added convenience, after registering for Text Giving you can use the following short codes to donate towards a particular fund. Simply text 8136697588 the amount you want to donate, enter a space, and then the short code and click send (Ex: 10 OFFER).
