



Pastor's Message

Weekend of March 14, 2021

Dear People of God,

This Sunday, the 2nd scrutiny of the catechumens takes place throughout our diocese. We here at MHC continue to walk the journey to full communion that our catechumen has been on these past two years with prayerful, fraternal support. I give special thanks to Tony Marincovich and his RCIA team who have been so faithful in leading and directing our catechumens and elect here at MHC for these past years. Thank you for another job well done, in with and under the difficult and trying conditions that COVID-19 has created for us all.

This is another one of those weeks, that because of the Scrutinies, the preacher has to provide a homily on Saturday evening with one set of readings, and a second homily on Sunday with a different set of readings.

On Saturday: The four basic truths we can take from the Gospel this week. (1) It's made clear that the Father in Heaven loves us with a profound and perfect love. (2) The Father's love was made manifest by the gift of His Son Jesus. (3) The only appropriate response we can make to such a gift is faith, believing in Jesus' mission and giving our lives to him in return. (4) The result of receiving Him and giving our lives to Him in return is that we are saved.

Reflect today about this brief summary of the Gospel. Know that in embracing this short passage of Scripture you are embracing the entire truth of God.

On Sunday: The story of the blind man whom Jesus heals is interesting on many fronts, one of which is the fact that this man does not seem to have a name. He is simply referred to as the "man blind from birth." This is significant in the Gospel of John because the lack of a name is also seen, for example, in the story of "the woman at the well." The fact that there is no Name seems to indicate that we should see ourselves in this story.

How He heals this man is also significant. Using His own spit on this man's eyes, which does not, at first reading, seem all that appealing. It does reveal, however, the fact that Jesus can use something exceptionally ordinary as a source of His divine grace. If we allow Jesus to give us all the gift of spiritual sight, we will be amazed at the beauty we all will behold.

As usual please remember to pray for all the Salesians in our presence here at MHC... especially those at St. Philip Residence. Be assured we will be doing the same for you.



When fasting, a person is permitted to eat one full meal, as well as two smaller meals that together are not equal to a full meal.

Am I excused from fasting and abstinence?

Those that are excused from fast and abstinence outside the age limits include the physically or mentally ill including individuals suffering from chronic illnesses such as diabetes. Also excluded are pregnant or nursing women.

Saint of the Week

St. Joseph, Spouse of the **Blessed Virgin Mary**

First Century Solemnity—March 19

The spouse of Mary the mother of Jesus and the legal father of Jesus according to Jewish law, Joseph is a model of humility and obedience to God's will. He followed God's instructions. given by angels in dreams, and took the pregnant Mary into his home as his wife, protected her and Jesus at the child's birth in Bethlehem through the family's sojourn in Egypt, and provided for them as a carpenter in

Nazareth. This feast, which was celebrated locally as early as the ninth century, became a universal feast in the fifteenth century, when it was placed on the liturgical calendar. Pope Pius IX named St. Joseph Patron of the Universal Church in 1870: he is also the patron saint of carpenters, the dying, and workers.





∠ Being a guardian is the distinctive trait of Joseph: Being the guardian is his great mission . . . We look to Joseph as the model educator, who watches over and accompanies Jesus as he grows 'in wisdom, age and grace,' as the Gospel says. He was not Jesus' father: the father of Jesus was God, but he was a father to Jesus, he was a father to Jesus in order to help him grow. And how did he help him grow? In wisdom, age and grace.
