Pastor's Message

Weekend of March 21, 2021

Dear People of God,

This Sunday, the 3rd scrutiny of the catechumens takes place throughout our diocese. We here at MHC continue to walk the journey to full communion that our catechumen has been on these past two years with prayerful, fraternal support. I give special thanks to Tony Marincovich and his RCIA team who have been so faithful in leading and directing our catechumens and elect here at MHC for these past years. Thank you for another job well done, in with and under the difficult and trying conditions that Covid has created for us all.

This is a rather special week in this season of Lent. Two wonderful saints are remembered during these days - St. Patrick on March 17th, and St. Joseph on March 19th. While we all are aware of the national and local celebrations on St. Patrick's Day. It certainly is right to rejoice in the life and mission of this courageous, determined and ever faithful evangelizer, by whose efforts not only Ireland, but through him, all of Europe and, indeed, the Church, came to Christianity by the seeds of faith sown by this one man and his followers. Happy St. Patrick's Day to one and all!

St. Joseph, on the other hand, has a tendency to slip between the cracks and into oblivion because of his apparent humble and quiet personality. All that we know of Joseph is found in the Infancy Narratives of St. Luke and St. Matthew. Nowhere in the Gospels do we ever hear anything Joseph says. He might be a man of few words, but he is most definitely a man of action: he does what the angel tells him; he takes Mary as his wife; he goes to Bethlehem; he finds a place to stay for the night; he takes his family to Egypt.... He is a man of action - not a man of words.

St. Joseph may have been a simple carpenter, but today he is venerated as one of the greatest saints in the Church. The Church has been celebrating this feast since the 10th century. St. Joseph is the patron saint of husbands, of fathers, the patron saint of families, the patron saint of homes, of workers; a special protector and patron of our Salesian Family; and the universal patron of the Church. That's not a bad list for someone of so few words.

On his feast day, and throughout the year, to this just and righteous man whose words we do not know, but whose life speaks so eloquently to us all, we simply say: St. Joseph pray for us!

As usual please remember to pray for all the Salesians in our presence here at MHC... especially those at St. Philip Residence. Be assured we will be doing the same for you.




