

Pastor's Message

Weekend of April 11, 2021

Dear People of God,

Today's feat of Divine Mercy reminds us that authority exercises power not only by judging, condemning and sentencing, but also by granting mercy.

When the priest's voice tells the penitent, "I absolve you from all of your sins in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit," guilt evaporates into thin air. The purest form and expression of power is the granting of mercy.

Mercy does not turn a blind eye to justice but fulfills its obligations to justice by going beyond them. After all, one cannot be absolved of having done nothing. Likewise, where there is no guilt, there is no need of mercy.

Because God is the seat of all authority, He is also the seat of all mercy.

St. Pope John Paul II first inserted this feast of Divine Mercy into the Roman Calendar on April 30, 2000, the canonization day of St. Faustina. St. Pope John Paul II was also canonized on Divine Mercy Sunday in 2014.

And so, the Church's third millennium was launched with a new devotion, a new piety rooted in the most ancient truths. Divine Mercy is the new face of God for this third millennium. This is the God who waits for us with bated breath to acknowledge in the privacy of the confessional, "Forgive me Father for I have sinned." This is the God who, at the end of time, whether our time or all time, waits to hear from each of us those few prized words, "Lord, have mercy." Having received that we need not receive anything more.



Divine Mercy Sunday-The Second Sunday of Easter

APRIL 11, 2021

Mankind's need for the message of Divine Mercy took on dire urgency in the 20th Century, when civilization began to experience an "eclipse of the sense of God" and, therefore to lose the understanding of the sanctity and inherent dignity of human life. In the 1930s, Jesus chose a humble Polish nun, St. Maria Faustina Kowalska, to receive private revelations concerning Divine Mercy that were recorded in her Diary. St. Faustina's Diary records 14 occasions when Jesus requested that a Feast of Mercy (Divine Mercy Sunday) be observed. On May 5, 2000, five days after the canonization of St. Faustina, the Vatican decreed that the Second Sunday of Easter would henceforth be known as Divine Mercy Sunday.

Jesus appeared to St. Faustina in a vision, with his right hand raised in a blessing and his left touching his garment above his heart. Red and white rays emanate from his heart, symbolizing the blood and water that was poured out for our salvation and our sanctification. The Lord requested that "Jesus, I trust in You" be inscribed under his image. Jesus asked that his image be painted and venerated throughout the world: "I promise that the soul that will venerate this image will not perish" (Diary, no. 48) and "By means of this image I will grant many graces to souls" (*Diary*, no. 742).





Consecration to St. Joseph

Pope Francis recently announced a "Year of St. Joseph," to help us learn more about this heroic member of the Holy Family, an ordinary man who fulfilled his purpose through obedience, love and trust in God. St. Joseph is the patron and protector of the Catholic Church and the patron saint of fathers.

Bishop Gregory Parkes will consecrate parishes, schools, ministries and the people of the Diocese of St. Petersburg to St. Joseph, the earthly father of Jesus Christ. This will take place at the Cathedral of St. Jude the Apostle at 12:00 noon on Saturday, May 1, the Memorial of St. Joseph the Worker.

The consecration will take place during Midday Prayer and it will be livestreamed for those unable to attend in person. Participants will fulfill part of the Plenary Indulgence requirements established by Pope Francis for the Year of St. Joseph, which began on December 8, 2020.

As one community, we will entrust our activity to the protection of St. Joseph and invoke the intercession of St. Joseph for those who are unemployed. We will also pray the Litany to St. Joseph.

We will be following CDC guidelines to prevent the spread of COVID-19.




