

Pastor's Message

For the Weekend of May 16, 2021

Dear People of God,

Happy and Blessed Feast of Mary Help of Christians!

This weekend we celebrate the namesake of our presence here in Tampa, including our parish. We will be celebrating a mass of unity in the gymnasium at 10:00 am with the Director of our presence here as main celebrant. This will be followed by a rosary procession ending with the crowning of the statue of Mary Help of Christians high atop our main building. An informal lunch will follow on the grounds by the lake, the pavilion, and the porch. To end the day, the blessing of Mary Help of Christians will be given to all at about 2:30pm.

One thought has come to me recently . . . encouraged by the words of our Provincial, Fr. Timothy Zak, SDB. He had encouraged us once again to start a group here that might be regarded as the third living monument raised up by St. John Bosco in honor of Mary Help of Christians and for the good of souls.

The Archconfraternity of the Devout Clients of Mary Help of Christians (ADMA) was approved by the Archbishop of Turin on April 18, 1869. On April 5, 1870 Pope Pius IX raised the Association to the dignity of an Archconfraternity.

The Association seeks to (1) promote the glory of the Most Holy Mother of Our Savior, in order to merit her protection in life and particularly at the hour of death. (2) Spread devotion to the Blessed Virgin and love for Jesus in the Blessed Sacrament. The rest of the rules of this pious Association will be listed on a separate flyer for your further information. What a blessing it would be if we could start a local group here at Mary Help.

A Marian Glossary

"She is that woman who rejoiced in the presence of God, who treasured everything in her heart, and who let herself be pierced by the sword. Mary is the saint among the saints, blessed above all others. She teaches us the way of holiness and she walks ever at our side. She does not let us remain fallen and at times she takes us into her arms without judging us." —Pope Francis, *Gaudete et Exsultate*, no. 176

Below is a brief outline of important terms about or related to the Blessed Mother.

ANNUNCIATION: The visit of the angel Gabriel to the virgin Mary to inform her that she was to be the mother of the Savior. After giving her consent to God's word, Mary became the mother of Jesus by the power of the Holy Spirit.

ASSUMPTION: The dogma which recognizes the Blessed Virgin Mary's singular participation in her Son's Resurrection by which she was taken up body and soul into heavenly glory, when the course of her earthly life was finished.

HAIL MARY: The prayer known in Latin as the Ave Maria. The first part of the prayer praises God for the gifts he gave to Mary as Mother of the Redeemer; the second part seeks her maternal intercession for the members of the Body of Christ, the Church, of which she is the Mother.

IMMACULATE CONCEPTION:

The dogma proclaimed in Christian Tradition and defined in 1854, that from the first moment of her conception, Mary—by the singular grace of God and by virtue of the merits of Jesus Christwas preserved immune from original sin.

MAGNIFICAT: The title commonly given to the Latin text and vernacular translation of the Canticle (or Song) of Mary that she recites at the time of the visitation. The canticle begins with "My soul pro claims the greatness of the Lord."



MARY: The mother of Jesus. Because she is the mother of Jesus-Son of God and second Person of the Blessed Trinity—according to the flesh, she is rightly called the Mother of God (Theotokos). Mary is also called "full of grace," and "Mother of the Church," and in Christian prayer and devotion, "Our Lady," the "Blessed Virgin Mary," and the "New Eve."

PRESENTATION: The presentation and dedication of Jesus to God by Mary and Joseph in the Temple (Lk 2:22-39), in accord with Mosaic Law concerning the first-born. At the Presentation, Simeon and Anna sum up the expectation of Israel for the long-awaited Messiah, the light of the nations and the glory of Israel, but also as a sign of contradiction. The presentation of the gifts, especially of bread and wine, is a preparatory rite for the liturgy of the Eucharist at Mass.

ROSARY: A prayer in honor of the Blessed Virgin Mary, which repeats the privileged Marian prayer Ave Maria, or Hail Mary, in "decades" of ten prayers, each preceded by the Pater Noster ("Our Father") and concluded by the Gloria Patri (Glory Be to the Father), accompanied by meditation on the mysteries of Christ's life. The rosary was developed by medieval piety in the Latin church as a popular substitute for the liturgical prayer of the Hours.

VIRGIN BIRTH: The conception of Jesus in the womb of the Virgin Mary solely by the power of the Holy Spirit. The Church's confession of faith in the virgin birth affirms that Jesus was conceived by the Holy Spirit without human seed.

VIRGIN MARY: The mother of Jesus, who is honored as "ever-virgin" for her perpetual virginity.

VISITATION: At the annunciation, the angel Gabriel told Mary that she would be the mother of the savior. Gabriel also told Mary that her barren cousin, Elizabeth, had conceived a son in her old age. Mary went to visit her cousin and confirmed the truth of the angel's words. The time she spent with Elizabeth is referred to as "the visitation."

Mary Help of Christians Novena

The title, "Mary, Help of Christians" refers to the special role of Mary in the trials of the Church. St. John Bosco is well-known for his devotion to Mary, Help of Christians. He saw her profound influence as protector and patroness. He would tell people, "Have faith in the Blessed Sacrament and Mary, Help of Christians and you will see what miracles are."

(*To be said at the beginning of each Novena day prayer)

*Remember, O most gracious Virgin Mary, that never was it known that anyone who fled to thy protection, implored thy help, and sought thy intercession, was left unaided, inspired with this confidence I fly unto thee; O Virgin of virgins, my Mother! To thee do I come, before thee I stand, sinful and sorrowful, O Mother of the Word Incarnate, despise not my petitions, but in thy mercy hear and answer me. Amen.

Day 1 - May 15

*Mary, Help of Christians, you helped defend the Christian faith over the course of history. Free me from infidelity or faithlessness and give me perseverance and strength to live an authentically Christian life in the world today. Mary, pray for me and ask God to grant the intentions I hold within my heart. (State your intentions here...) Most loving Mary, you were given to all Christians as their help and protector in the most difficult times in the life of Christians and the life of the Church. Help me to come to you during times of need and especially at the time of my death, that I may be victorious over the evil one as you are. Amen. Mary Help of Christians, Pray for us! Amen.

Day 2 - May 16

*Mary, Help of Christians, listen to my prayers as I ask for your help to avoid sin. Have mercy on me! Mary, pray for us and ask God to grant the intentions we hold within our hearts. Help me to come to you during times of need and especially at the time of my death, that I may be victorious over the evil one as you are. Amen. Mary Help of Christians, Pray for us! Amen.

*Mary, Help of Christians, you showed your great protection over the Church throughout

the centuries. In this time that Christians are persecuted throughout the world, spread your protection over the Church and protect Christians and the Holy Father from attacks of the enemy. 

The Sacrament of Baptism
