



Pastor's Message

Weekend of May 30, 2021

Dear People of God,

Trinity Sunday, officially called The Solemnity of the Most Host Holy Trinity, is one of the few celebrations of the Christian Year that commemorates a reality and a doctrine rather than a person or event. Some of the greatest minds throughout history have attempted, to the best of their ability, to explain this mystery to the rest of us.

On Trinity Sunday, rather than try to solve the mystery, let us ask how open we are to it: the mystery of why God created us to begin with; the mystery of God loving us, desiring to be part of our lives, to live in our hearts; to be one with us; the mystery of God inviting us to share in the life of the Trinity: Father, Son and Spirit; the mystery of a God who cares for us like a loving parent who lays down his life for us, like a best friend, who fills our hearts, like a lover who will not be refused.

While the Holy Trinity is a mystery that cannot be proven by Scripture, we come into contact through our liturgy, with the Father, the Son and the Holy Spirit. Let us pray with faith and confidence the prayer we learn from this source: "The grace and peace of our Lord, Jesus Christ, the love of God the Father, and the communion of the Holy Spirit be with you all."

Father today we pause also to reflect the sacrifice made by those who paid the ultimate price on behalf of our nation. We pray that their sacrifices are never forgotten, nor is the pain of their families.

We acknowledge that freedom comes at a cost and pray that we can pursue peace. We hope that, one day, we might be able to celebrate Memorial Day as just a memory of the time before we started living the peaceful existence You intended for us since the beginning of creation.

On this Memorial Day we pray for peace and for those who gave all. Lead us toward a world where no one must give their lives in pursuit of freedom. May we be receptive to Your guidance, and may we never forget the fallen.

Let's also remember to pray for the sick and hospital or homebound members of our faith family. They rightfully rely on our remembrances and support.

Please take note of upcoming parish events listed elsewhere in our weekly online bulletin. Do your best to participate and support them in any way you can.

As usual please remember to pray for all of the Salesians in our presence here at MHC . . . especially those at St. Philip Residence. Be assured we will be doing the same for you.

The Solemnity of the Most Holy Trinity

MAY 30, 2021

The Mystery of the Holy Trinity

"The Feast of the Most Holy Trinity leads us to contemplate the mystery of God who unceasingly creates, redeems and sanctifies, always with love and through love." – Pope Francis, May 27, 2018

The mystery of the Holy Trinity is the central mystery of the Christian faith and life. God reveals himself as Father, Son, and Holy Spirit. The doctrine of the Trinity includes three truths of faith.

First, the Trinity is One. We do not speak of three gods but of one God. Each of the Persons is fully God. They are a unity of Persons in one divine nature.

Second, the Divine Persons are distinct from each other. Father, Son, and Spirit are not three appearances or modes of God, but three identifiable persons, each fully God in a way distinct from the others.

Third, the Divine Persons are in relation to each other. The distinction of each is understood only in reference to the others. The Father cannot be the Father without the Son, nor can the Son be the Son without the Father. The Holy Spirit is related to the Father and the Son who both send him forth.

All Christians are baptized in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit. The Trinity illumines all the other mysteries of faith.

The Feast of the Visitation of Mary

Monday, May 31, 2021

This feast commemorates the three-month visit of Mary with her elderly cousin Elizabeth during Mary's pregnancy with Jesus and Elizabeth's with John the Baptist. The story appears in the first chapter of Luke's Gospel. It recounts Elizabeth's Spirit-filled greeting, acknowledging Mary as "the mother of my Lord," and Mary's beautiful response, the Magnificat, which begins, "My soul proclaims the greatness of the Lord." Introduced by the Franciscans in 1263, the feast became universal in the 16th century.


Candles: The Light of Christ
