

Pastor's Message

For the Weekend of June 6, 2021

Dear People of God

The Solemnity of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ today, (Corpus Christi) brings to mind the awesome institution of this sacrament at the Last Supper. In todays' first reading we see Moses relaying to the people in the desert, the Lord's words, laws, and ordinances. They respond with one voice, "We will do everything that the Lord has told us."

The second reading of Paul to the Hebrews compares the old offering of goats and bulls and the sprinkling of a heifer's ashes with the sacrifice of the body and blood of Jesus Christ himself. If one could sanctify those who are defiled with these offerings, "how much more will the body and blood of Christ . . ." do so, and more besides.

Jesus fulfills this offering, giving us his own body and blood under the forms of bread and wine. In this way, our hunger is satisfied in abundance as we make our pilgrim way to the heavenly banquet.

This week we will once again pick up the tradition of bringing up the gifts of bread and wine. I can't think of a more appropriate time to do so than on the feast of Corpus Christi.

Pope Francis' Prayer Intentions for June



The Beauty of Marriage

Let us pray for young people who are preparing for marriage with the support of a Christian community: may they grow in love, with generosity, faithfulness and patience.

THE SOLEMNITY OF THE MOST HOLY BODY AND BLOOD OF CHRIST

When the bread and wine become the Body of Christ, why do they still look and taste like bread and wine?

In the celebration of the Eucharist, the glorified Christ becomes present under the appearances of bread and wine in a way that is unique, a way that is uniquely suited to the Eucharist. In the Church's traditional theological language, in the act of consecration during the Eucharist the "substance" of the bread and wine is changed by the power of the Holy Spirit into the "substance" of the Body and Blood of Jesus Christ. At the same time, the "accidents" or appearances of bread and wine remain. "Substance" and "accident" are here used as philosophical terms that have been adapted by great medieval theologians such as St. Thomas Aquinas in their efforts to understand and explain the faith. Such terms are used to convey the fact that what appears to be bread and wine in every way (at the level of "accidents" or physical attributes—that is, what can be seen, touched, tasted, or measured) in fact is now the Body and Blood of Christ (at the level of "substance" or deepest reality). This change at the level of substance from bread and wine into the Body and Blood of Christ is called "transubstantiation." According to Catholic faith, we can speak of the Real Presence of Christ in the Eucharist because this transubstantiation has occurred (cf. Catechism, no. 1376).

Bid me come to Thee above,




Entering God's Presence

There are Seven Sacraments of the Catholic Church.

The sacraments of initiation into the Body of Christ are Baptism, Confirmation, and Eucharist.

The sacraments of healing and peace are Reconciliation and Anointing of the Sick.

The sacraments of vocation are Marriage and Holy Orders.

The Sacrament of Baptism

2021 Hurricane Season

The hurricane season started on June 1st. Here are resources to help you remember the steps to follow when a hurricane or severe storm threatens our area.

Be Prepared

In the storms of life, we turn to God and pray that we will be spared from harm. We are also called to take the necessary precautions to protect the precious gift of life and to minimize damage to property. Here are a few helpful reminders:

Evacuation Shelters:

If you are elderly or have special needs, please contact your county's Emergency Management Office to preregister prior to any storm if you will need to evacuate.

Mass Participation:

All parishioners are urged to use good judgment when deciding if conditions are safe to travel to Mass. In the event that roadways are not clear and weather conditions are unsafe to travel, the faithful are reminded that the obligation to participate in the Sunday Mass does not apply when there is grave difficulty in fulfilling this obligation (Code of Canon Law, Canon 1248 §2).
