#### Dear People of God,

This Sunday, the 3rd scrutiny of the catechumens takes place throughout our diocese. We here at MHC continue to walk the journey to full communion that our catechumens have been on this past year with prayerful, fraternal support. I give special thanks to Tony Marincovich and our RCIA team, to Ann Marie Brummett and her Religious Education team, to the Korean Ministry team, to Fr. Eddie Chincha, SDB and the CRTSH team, and to Fr. Franco, our Director, who have been so faithful in leading and directing our catechumens and elect here at MHC for these past years. Thank you for another job well done.

This is a rather special week in this season of Lent. Two wonderful saints are remembered during these days - St. Patrick on March 17<sup>th</sup>, and St. Joseph on March 19<sup>th</sup>. While we all are aware of the national and local celebrations on St. Patrick's Day. It certainly is right to rejoice in the life and mission of this courageous, determined and ever faithful evangelizer, by whose efforts not only Ireland, but through him, all of Europe and, indeed, the Church, came to Christianity by the seeds of faith sown by this one man and his followers. Happy St. Patrick's Day to one and all!

St. Joseph, on the other hand, has a tendency to slip between the cracks and into oblivion because of his apparent humble and quiet personality. All that we know of Joseph is found in the Infancy Narratives of St. Luke and St. Matthew. Nowhere in the Gospels do we ever hear anything Joseph says. He might be a man of few words, but he is most definitely a man of action: he does what the angel tells him; he takes Mary as his wife; he goes to Bethlehem; he finds a place to stay for the night; he takes his family to Egypt.... He is a man of action - not a man of words.

St. Joseph may have been a simple carpenter, but today he is venerated as one of the greatest saints in the Church. The Church has been celebrating this feast since the 10<sup>th</sup> century. St. Joseph is the patron saint of husbands, of fathers, the patron saint of families, the patron saint of homes, of workers; a special protector and patron of our Salesian Family; and the universal patron of the Church. That's not a bad list for someone of so few words.

On his feast day, and throughout the year, to this just and righteous man whose words we do not know, but whose life speaks so eloquently to us all, we simply say: St. Joseph pray for us!

Many thanks to Mr. Steve Jarosz and his Antioch Retreat team for another year of grace and joy given and shared with both those who worked and attended this years' retreat.

Titus Zeman (4 January 1915 – 8 January 1969) was a Slovak Roman Catholic priest and a professed member of the Salesians of Don Bosco. <sup>1</sup> Zeman studied in Italian cities prior to

his ordination and worked in Slovakia to protect fellow Salesians after the communist regime out lawed religious orders.<sup>[2]</sup> He was arrested after attempting to send Salesians out of the nation and was imprisoned from 1952 until 1964 and died due to poor health sustained from the prison conditions. He has been acclaimed as a defender of religious liberties.

Zeman was acclaimed a Servant of God in 2010 under Pope Benedict XVI after the canonization process commenced in Bratislava – the cause was taken with ascertaining whether Zeman had died "in odium fidei" (in hatred of the faith).<sup>[4]</sup> Pope rancis approved his beatification on 27 February 2017; the beatification occurred in Bratislava on 30 September 2017.
