Dear People of God,

We may have already heard the story of the little boy who was quite anxious and excited because his grandmother was coming to visit. He was up early on the day itself and at his parents' bedside. "Is she here yet?" "No, she'll be here after lunch." "Oh."

By breakfast he had a solution: "Let's eat lunch early!"

The season of Advent is a time of joyful expectation. The Lord is coming! Wake up! Get ready! We probably cannot hope to be as excited as this little boy, but the church puts us in touch with the eagerness of the early Christians at Thessalonica.

The Thessalonians who first read Paul's letter were only a few years removed from Jesus' ascension and were expecting him to return in glory any day. "Paul strongly encourages them "to increase and abound in love for one another and for all. . . . and to be blameless in holiness before our God and Father at the coming of our Lord Jesus with all his holy ones." With the passage of years, the church realized that it might be a long time before Jesus came a second time. That brought other problems. The delay could make us forget or become complacent about his coming.

That is where we are today. The First Sunday of Advent comes as a surprise in the humdrum of our daily lives. We are running around as usual, from one task to the next, one busy day to the next, when suddenly here it is again. What? Is it that time of the year again?

The church encourages us to slow down, to refocus, to wait for the coming of the Lord in quiet hope. The idea of the Lord's coming has expanded since the time of the Thessalonians. We still look forward to his coming in glory at the end of time, but we concentrate more now on preparing ourselves for his present coming in grace and we look back to his first coming, the Incarnation, to understand what it means for us.

The Novena to the Immaculate Conception begins Saturday, November 30th and runs through December 8th. Copies of the Novena are available at the back of the Church, or at the parish office. Pray it every day.

Margherita Occhiena was born on 1 April 1788 in Capriglio in Asti, the sixth of ten children. At the age of 24 she married 27 year old Francesco Bosco, a family friend and widower whose wife and infant daughter had died shortly after childbirth, leaving him with a three-year-old son, Anthony. The family settled in Becchi, a hamlet of Castelnuovo d'Asti (today Castelnuovo Don Bosco). Francesco died of pneumonia in May 1817, leaving the 29-year-old Margherita

a single mother with three sons: Antonio, Giuseppe and Giovanni (John). [1] A strong woman with clear ideas, Occhiena raised her sons with a regimen of sober living, strict but reasonable. The boys were quite different in temperament. Still, Occhiena made sure she presented them with the beginnings of a Christian education. She gave them the example of faith, wisdom, and courage in facing the difficulties of life. [1]
