Dear People of God,

After listening to Jesus' words in the Gospel this week, we all might be thinking that we certainly do not want to be like the scribes! We do not want to receive similar condemnation and, thus, we should avoid their state of sin. So that begs the question, "What sin of the scribes earned them this severe condemnation?"

The bottom line is that they were frauds, phonies, two-faced. They were consumed with a desire for "places of honor." They clearly treated others poorly: "They devour the houses of widows." What's worse, they presented themselves as people of prayer when they clearly were not. As a result, Jesus severely condemned them.

We should hopefully learn two things from this Gospel: (1) The true place of honor is the place of the greatest humility. It is found when we serve without notice and give without recognition. and (2) Prayer is about one thing. It's about establishing a relationship with Him in a deep, beautiful and abiding way. It's about love. Prayer is not for show or to gain the admiration of others.

Prayer: "Lord, Jesus help me to be a person of true prayer and worship. Help me to remain humble and true. Help me to love You out of love of You alone. Jesus I trust in You."

Blessed Michael Rua first successor of Don Bosco.

Born in Turin on June 9, 1837, the youngest of nine children, Michael came to the Oratory in 1852. One day, Don Bosco told him: "We will go halves in everything." He was among the first group to whom Don Bosco suggested the formation of the Salesian Society.

At the explicit request of the Founder, in 1884, Pope Leo XIII named him to



succeed Don Bosco and confirmed him as Rector Major in 1888. Fr. Michael was seen as the 'Living Rule' because of his austere fidelity, yet he also displayed a fatherly spirit that was capable of great thoughtfulness, so much so that he was known as 'a king of kindness.' When beatifying him, Pope Paul VI stated: "The Salesian Family owes its origin to Don Bosco and, to Fr. Michael, its continuation...he developed the Saint's example into a school, his Rule into a spirit, his holiness into a model. He turned the spring into a river." His remains are venerated in the crypt of the Basilica of Mary Our Help.


