Dear People of God,

For twenty-three years so many people in our country have carried with them the scars - hurt, anger, fear, loss, anxiety, confusion and the need for retaliation and temporal justice, that the events of 9/11/2001 rained down upon us from the skies over Manhattan, NY, Shanksville, PA, and Arlington, VA. Where are we now? How far have we come from all of the above? How many of these feelings are still with us? I don't know who I feel most pained for; those who have been unable to move on with life since then; or those who have either forgotten or willfully choose to ignore the harsh lessons learned by those tragic events. Let me share this prayer and reflection with you that is still so relevant for all of us dealing with the troubles of today.

Twenty-three years have passed, O Lord, twenty-three years of mourning and of tears, of struggling to make sense and to go on. Twenty-three years since crashing planes, collapsing buildings, rivers of smoke and ash brought death and fear.

Give us the courage to hope again, Father. To pray even for our enemies, and for ourselves. Give us the grace to be freed from hate and unbound from the paralysis of fear. Give us the freedom of the children of God.

Awaken in our hearts a firm resolve "to reject the ways of violence, to combat everything that sow's hatred and division within the human family, and to work for the dawn of a new era of solidarity, justice and peace."

We ask this through the Prince of Peace, our Way, our Truth, and our Life, Christ the Lord. Amen,

"Ephphatha!" - that is, "Be opened!" (Mark 7:34). These are powerful words. Why are they powerful? They are powerful because they actually accomplish what they say. These words are spoken by Jesus after the deaf man is brought to Him with the request for healing. By saying the command "Be opened!" the deaf man's ears are opened, and his speech impediment is removed. When Jesus speaks, His word changes things. This is true in this story, but it is

also true in our lives. We all are deaf and mute at times. We don't always hear the voice of God, and we don't always speak His word and words of charity. For that reason, Jesus' words must be spoken to us. "Ephphatha! Be opened!" Reflect, today, upon how open you are to hearing the voice of God. Spend some time alone with the Lord and let Him heal you so that you can hear more clearly all that He is saying to you.

Prayer: "Lord, I do not always listen to You. Please speak Your words of healing to me so that I can hear You more clearly. In hearing You, may I listen to all You have to say. Jesus, I trust in You.
