Weekend of September 29, 2024

Dear People of God,

What a powerful reading this week! The Gospel today reminds us that the Kingdom of God is all embracing and larger than the Church. During Mark's time there already existed a tendency among some of Jesus' followers to make God's kingdom and exclusive club, limited to likeminded people.

Who of us is not stirred in mind, body and soul at the words of Jesus. Does he really expect us to act on his words literally? Should we really cut off our hand if it causes us to sin? Should we also cut off our foot and pluck out our eye if it causes us to sin?

The context of this passage is that we ought not to lead others into scandal and sin. In fact, it would be better if we had "a great millstone" put around our neck and were thrown into the sea than to cause another to sin. It doesn't sound like a very pleasant way to meet our maker.

What I think Jesus is trying to tell us is that the hand, foot, or eye is a symbol of those friends who work hard to draw us into sin. It's better that these friendships end than to be drawn into Hell with them. And if we are the "friend" drawing others to sin, it's better for us to cut our friendship off with those we are tempting.

A close friend can bring great consolation in the knowledge that your friend is deeply committed to you and will always be there for you. But every friendship must be continually evaluated in the light of faith and truth.

Prayer: Lord, I thank You for all the friendships in my life. I thank you for giving me people who care. Help me to always be a good friend and to always examine my friendships in the light of faith. Jesus, I trust in You.

Aloysius Guanella was born in 1842 at Campodolcino, Italy, and from his family upbringing learned to love work and practise charity to the poor. As teacher and parish priest at Savogno, he built the school and organized Catholic Action among the young. During this time he came in contact with Don Bosco and joined him in 1875. For

three years he was a Salesian, working in the San Luigi Oratory of Turin, and later as director of the Dupraz College at Trinita, Cuneo. Recalled to his diocese by his bishop, he opened a school for poor children at Traona, Sondrio, but subsequently had to close it because of the hostility of the civil authorities.


